#### Little British Car Company Adventure Part 2 Brooklands

To continue our series on the Little British Car Company Adventure in England, we journeyed to Brooklands, near Weybridge in Surrey. This is a must see motoring attraction in the UK. It is the first purpose built motor racing circuit in the world and one of Britain's first airfields (the track being a major aviation site beginning in 1908). It became Britain's largest aircraft manufacturing center by 1918, later producing military aircraft such as the Wellington bomber and civil airliners like the Viscount and VC-10. There are a number of significant aircraft on display and manufacturing facilities. Racing was suspended during WWI and resumed on a limited basis until August 1939. The first flight of the Hawker Hurricane, a famous fighter aircraft in the Battle of Britain, was here in 1935. Today the track and factory are Brooklands Museum, a major aviation and motoring museum, as well as a venue for vintage car, motorcycle and other transport-related events.


The motor circuit (or race track) is the site of many notable records in early racing. This included the 1<sup>st</sup> 24 hour race and the first time a motor car achieved 100 MPH. In July and August 1929, Violette Cordery and her younger sister Evelyn drove her 4.5 liter four-seater Invicta for 30,000 miles in less than 30,000 minutes (approximately 20 days, 20 hours), averaging 61.57 mph and earning her second Dewar Trophy from the Royal Automobile Club.

Along the center of the track ran a dotted black line, known as the Fifty Foot Line. By driving over the line, a driver could theoretically take the banked corners without having to use the steering wheel.

There is a lot to see at Brooklands: cars, bicycles, motorcycles and planes. Also *Mercedes-Benz World* with test tracks (including part of the original Campbell Circuit), an off-road circuit, and extensive Mercedes-Benz showrooms. Plan on staying a whole day, you won't be disappointed.
