

THE TUCSON BRITISH CAR



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From the Cockpit of the Vice PREZ



So.....I have been looking to get new tires for my Sunbeam Alpine. Presently I have "Falken" tires, 185/70R13 made in Thailand (I didn't know Thailand even made tires). The car made in 1965 would have had 6.00-13 cross-ply tires installed at the factory.....which of course you can't get any more except for very expensive places like Coker Tire. Although I am trying to keep some semblance of originality, I don't want cross-ply tires on the car. One, they are skinny and two, they are somewhat unpredictable. On a smooth surface you can get good handling with cross plies, but they are VERY sensitive to irregularities in the road and prone to following them. What I am looking toward is a set of radials that are slightly wider, but not so wide as to hit the inner wheel wells when a make a turn. The 185/70R13s do hit my inside wheel well when making a sharp turn, so something less wide. The radial equivalent of a 6.00-13 tire is 155/80-13. If choose the 155/80-13, the new tires would be narrower (-1.18") and not quite as tall (-0.44") so the tire circumference would be smaller by (-1.38"). A narrower width = not hitting the inner wheel well! So, I think I will go with the 165/80-13's which has a width increase over the 155/80-13's by 0.39", should be OK! Now I have to go find them.....

As a point of interest, for those that want a smaller or larger tire for their car, a great site to look at is Tacomaworld.com. This is a tire size calculator that you can enter tire sizes and get the figures including speedometer differences as well as rotations per mile.

The forum survey sent out in May has been completed and we are now moving forward to getting the forum on-line for all member use. My expectation after a few trial runs, is that by mid-July all our members will receive instructions on use with approval.

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

On the Road – Emergency!

Stuff Happens! - Who Are Your Relatives? - Notification In Case of a Problem By Pete Williams

I have been thinking about what we <u>really</u> know about each other in our club. I don't want to spoil our positive, light atmosphere. I personally don't want to know all of your info until...

In my case I have no family members in Tucson or anywhere close by. I also drive across the country when I migrate as a snowbird and make other long-distance trips. If something were to happen to me, how would family members be contacted or notified? I do carry that information on my phone, but no one has access to it other than me. My driver's license has information that would not facilitate contacting anyone and the issuing state does not have this info either.

As an organized car club, we know you have an interest in British cars. Some members we know well. Other members we may only know a part of your name when we have outings and tours. We also know your name and address through our roster, but who carries one of those around? The TBCR roster does not have family / emergency contact information.

We each need to be responsible and have some means of identifying our emergency contacts not only in our cars, but also in our wallets. If something happens on a tour those responding to an emergency need contact info **NOW**!

I suggest simple information cards. At a minimum, here's what should go on the card:

- Your name (spouse name and contact number), responsible family member name and contact number,
- Optional: known major medical conditions.

Make sure you use a ball point pen that doesn't smear. If you have trembling hands, get someone with steady hands to clearly print the information on the card. I suggest emergency contact info on both of the following:

- A 4 x 6 / 3 x 5 card in a small Ziplock in each car's glove box.
- A business card placed in your wallet.
- If you are at a campground / motel include one of their business cards in your wallet.

I really hope nothing ever happens that requires the use of this information. I am going to start putting these cards in my cars and in my wallet. I hope you do too. After all, it would be a shame if something happened to you (we hope it doesn't) and your family can't be found.

While it may seem to be inappropriate, your passengers should also have their information with them. Ask them and tell them why.
