With Pete now enjoying the fertile fields of Wisconsin (or at least driving there), we all will be here getting ready for a nice.... long..... hot..... summer. As we heat up, this is a great time to get our LBC's & BBC's on the road. I am sure that many of you, driving in the summer, have had heating issues. I personally use a product called Water Wetter that claims temp drops of up to 20 degrees, I believe for the most part if you can see a temp drop of 5-10 degrees your doing good. Just add to your radiator with distilled water and you are ready to go. I use a 50/50 mix and have had good results. If you are still running too warm for your taste, then you might consider a lower temp. thermostat and an additional fan in front of the radiator.

During the month of May, TBCR will have a great opportunity to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the MGB that will be held on **May 22, 2022 (Sunday) at 9:30 a.m. at Brandi Fenton Park, Ramada 2.**So all you "B" aficionados are asked to come to the event, <u>and</u> also the "A"s and "T"s and all other members so that we can have a great showing. The MG marque had their roots in the 1920's as a sideline to Morris Garages and by 1924 the MG with the MG Octagon badge was registered as a trademark by Morris Garages. 1928 saw the company being large enough that warranted an identity separate from the original Morris Garages and the M.G. Car Company was used from March of that year. Eventually, the company during the production build of the MGB was manufactured by the British Motor Corporation (BMC) and later the Austin-Morris division of British Leyland.

The MGB that we are celebrating started production in 1962 and ended production in 1980 with over 523K vehicles built of the three variants: MGB, MGC and the MGB GT V8.

Recently our club officers have been discussing having a forum for our members use. Since a number of us are having difficulty getting our cars worked on or finding somebody locally that can work on a British car, perhaps having a forum available for discussion, recommendations, help from other members, etc. may help. The club will be sending out a survey asking for your recommendation either for or against having a TBCR forum. The forum can possibly accept downloaded pics, will most probably have a monitor for password usage and acceptable language. The upcoming survey will explain the proposed forum rules with the hope of answering any questions.
