# What's A Midget Ashley Conversion?

The following unusual car was spotted in one of the 2023 Barrett-Jackson Scottsdale Auction tents.

According to the BJ sale placard, this car was a 1972 Midget with an Ashley GT conversion package. It was purpose built in England to compete in the New England 1000 and was successfully campaigned. It was powered by a built 1600 engine with Weber Carbs and was mated to a 4-speed transmission. It sold for \$25,000. The car was very interesting and in great looking condition.

# For Sale

#### Quick Jack Set Manufactured by BendPak \$1,000 firm (Cash)

3/12/23 - Amazon pricing: List \$1,675, Sale price \$1475. Not including shipping or tax Used a few times before I built my new garage. This is not needed and needs to be moved on.

#### Package Contains:

2 Lift Channels, 2 handles, 2 sets of small wheels for portability on each channel, 4 tall blocks, 4 shorter blocks, 2 wall hanging hooks with stout lag bolts. Assembled hydraulic pump assembly with 4 hoses to / from the pump (operated on 120 Volts). Hydraulic oil installed. Original instruction / user manual. Collapsed dimensions: Each Channel - 70" long, 3.25" high, 11" wide.

Max Capacity 5,000 lbs. Each lift section fits under the sills / frame of a car. (Fits perfectly between the wheels of an MGB with the tires in place.) Each channel has safety locks which hold the channels in the up position.

Notes: Orange straps were used in place of the metal handles (easier) to position each channel when moved from the prior building. Cannot be driven over. Easily slid under the side of the car. Each channel is heavy. Can easily be stored under a car. In the up or storage positions the hydraulic hoses can be disconnected and stored - the fluid is retained by the couplings.
